Honor Flight Philadelphia honors our own Ed Conlon

Wow! Monday, October 1st... what a rewarding day! I had the honor of being guardian to Korea War Veteran, Mr Ed Conlon on Honor Flight Philadelphia. The day began at Flourtown Country Club at 7AM, along with 49 other WWII and Korean War Veterans. We boarded the buses en route to Arlington National Cemetery and Washington D.C. to tour all monuments and memorials.

The entire trip was police escorted from start to finish from Pennsylvania to Washington D.C and back. Rock Star treatment for our Heroes! All meals were provided along with a never ending supply of snacks and drinks throughout the day.

On the trip home the buses pulled into the PA Welcome Center on I-95 to a welcoming contingent of approximately 40 motorcycles and 14 police and fire vehicles to escort our heroes home. I-95 was *completely closed down* to give our veterans the presidential treatment. On every overpass, firemen in dress uniforms on top of fire trucks with flags flying high, saluted as the heroes on the buses went by.

At this time I took the opportunity to look at the faces of these veterans... the expressions on their faces and the tears in their eyes were priceless.

Upon disembarking the buses our heroes were thanked for their service with hugs and handshakes from about 70 residents, legionnaires and boy scouts all waving flags as they were escorted down a red carpet to a sit-down dinner.

Mr. Conlon, sir, thank you for allowing me to share your memories, your military experiences and your friendship. This experience with you I will always cherish!

Editor's Note: Since 2006, The Honor Flight Network, is a nonprofit organization created to honor America's WWII and Korean War veterans by transporting them to Washington DC to visit war memorials free of charge. Defense Authorization Act expands benefits for disabled vets.

In August, President Trump signed the "John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act" for FY 2019 which includes provisions expanding benefits for disabled veterans and their caregivers.

Beginning in January 2020, Purple Heart recipients and service-connected disabled veterans and their caregivers will be authorized to use base commissary stores as well as Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) facilities. Also, totally disabled veterans will be eligible to use space-available ("Space-A") travel.

Largest VA Budget Ever Passed

The Department of Veterans Affairs fiscal 2019 budget was signed into law on September 21, providing an increase of more than 6% and driving total agency spending over \$200 billion for the first time.

The bill includes \$1.1 billion for the start of a VA electronic health records overhaul and \$400 million for opioid abuse prevention. It also provides \$1.75 billion to fund VA Mission Act, passed earlier this year. That legislation dramatically increased the Department's community care programs, expanding veterans ability to access private health care at taxpayer expense. The money needed to fund that law had stalled negotiations on the budget bill for months. As a short-term fix, lawmakers shifted money from other VA accounts to cover that fiscal gap.

Remembering Billy Oxley

November 11 marks the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day – the end of World War I - and it's appropriate that we commemorate the event. Of the 4.7 million men who served in the United States armed forces in World War I, there were an estimated 360,000 casualties including 116,000 dead and 204,000 wounded. The US lost more personnel to disease (63,114) than to combat (53,402), largely due to the influenza epidemic of 1918. One of those who died in battle was our post's namesake, William Oxley, age 19, died August 2 during the Battle of the Ourcq. (The Ourcq is a tributary river of the Marne River located approximately 55 miles northeast of Paris).

Research conducted in 2011 by our own **Wes Schlueter, Mike Kennedy** and other members of the Sons discovered a letter written by Oxley's Company Commander which was subsequently reported in the September 28, 2011 *Northeast Times*:

Oxley was killed by a series of three bombs in an overnight German air raid while he and fellow American troops slept in the woods. In all, six were killed and 25 injured.

"William was one of my best men, a brave scrapper and always ready to give everything he had, no matter what was required of him," E.J. Stackpole Jr., captain of the 110th Infantry, wrote in an Oct. 30, 1918 letter to Oxley's father, Joseph.

Stackpole explained in the letter that, on July 30, 1918, the Americans "cleaned the Germans out" of a certain wooded area. Oxley and the captain were in the leading wave during the engagement, and a German machine gunner was about to shoot Stackpole at close range. Oxley picked him off with his rifle.

"Consequently, I owe my life to your boy and I'll never forget that," the captain wrote, as he recovered from gunshot wounds to his legs at an American Red Cross hospital in Paris. "You may well be proud of your son's record and the sacrifice he and you have made for our country."

68th Anniversary of the Battle of Chosin Reservoir Remembered

Let us also remember those who fought and died at the Chosin Reservoir November 17 – December 13, 1950 when the American X Corps, outnumbered by more than 4 to1 was attacked by 10 Chinese Divisions in the early days of the Korean War. By the end of the battle, U.S. Marines suffered 836 dead and around 10,000 wounded. The Army had 2,000 dead and 1,000 wounded. The Chinese had the most catastrophic losses. Six Chinese divisions were completely wiped out. Of the ten that attacked, only one would ever see action again. Though the exact numbers are not clear, historians estimate Chinese losses anywhere from 30,000 to 80,000 killed. The numbers of Chinese wounded may never be known.
